Community Help (Food Bank)

"Following a question from me to a friend of mine who meets on a monthly basis with a group of Christian MPs at Westminster for prayer, I asked him if he could find out for me the scripture which I believed was written around the walls of the lobby. There is no reference to this at all in reference or guide books on the Palace of Westminster.

Anyway he has just written to me and said "When I was in the Palace of Westminster last week I looked at the mosaic in the floor of the Central Lobby - I strained my memories of O Level Latin!
